Cooperative Burning: Trinity County

 Over last 8 years, WRTC and partners have developed a cooperative burning program that spans the county

 Work is focused around CWPP, prioritizing key parcels ranging from north of Trinity Lake to Weaverville, Hayfork, and into Southern Trinity





Cooperative Burning: Trinity County

- Building interagency relationships, partnerships and formal agreements has been critical for success.
- WRTC has agreements/partnerships with:
 - 3 volunteer fire departments
 - Shasta-Trinity and Six Rivers NFs (for sharing crews and burning on both public and private lands)
 - CAL FIRE (for VMP burning, permitting, and standby fire protection on LE-7 permitted burns)
 - BLM collaborates where projects align





Cooperative Burning: Trinity County

- WRTC works with landowners and prepares burn plans, TNC provides technical review, and Firestorm generally leads burns on private parcels, providing both qualified burn boss, insurance and crews.
- Over the last year, WRTC has red-carded 12 employees and brought in the Trinity County RCD with six of their crewmembers.
- WRTC has ~2000 acres under approved burn plans and has implemented on about 200-300 acres/year in the WUI over the last 5 years.



Cooperative Burning: Humboldt County





- Oak woodland management has become rallying point for landowners interested in burning
- \$2.68 million grant through NRCS includes VMP burning, but interest exceeds agency capacity
- Starting to look at models from other regions—how can we boost private landowners' capacity for Rx fire?
